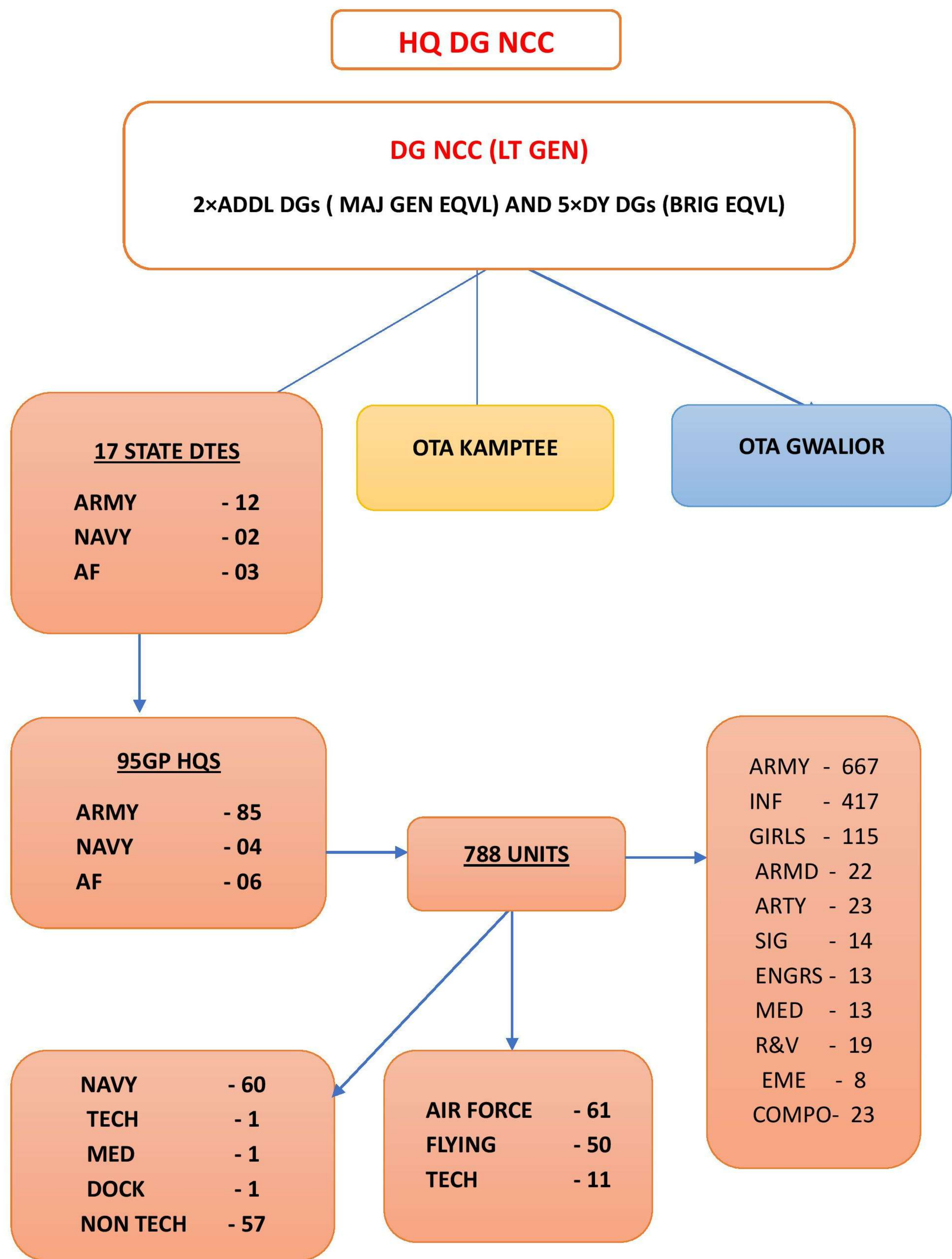

NCC FLAG



The NCC Flag for various units of the NCC was First introduced in 1951. The Flag was of same pattern, colour and size as was used by various regiments of the Army. The only difference was that it had the NCC badge and unit designation placed in the centre. Later on it was felt that the flag should be in keeping with the inter-service character of the Corps. In 1954 the existing tricolour flag was introduced. The three colours in the flag depict the three services of the Corps, red for the Army, deep blue for the Navy and light blue for the Air Force. The letters NCC and the NCC crest in gold in the middle of the flag encircled by a wreath of lotus, give the flag a colourful look and a distinct identity. Each lotus represents one NCC Directorate. The two dots represents Officer Training Academies in India; at Kamptee, Maharashtra and Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh.

BIRTH OF THE NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The Kashmir war of 1947-48 taught a very important lesson to India, that freedom needs to be protected by strong Armed Forces. Its immediate manifestation was that the recommendations of Kunzru Committee were placed before the Constituent Assembly (Legislature) on 13th March, 1948. A draft Bill was sent to the Constituent Assembly (Legislative) on 19th March, 1948, which evoked great interest and enthusiasm amongst all members. After due deliberations and amendments, the bill was passed by the Assembly on 8th April, 1948. The Central Govt. accepted the opinion of the Provincial Govt. and the Standing Committee's recommendations for the formation of a cadet corps which was to be named as "National Cadet Corps", as recommended by the Kunzru Committee.

The Bill received the assent of the Governor General on 16th April, 1948 and the National Cadet Corps came into being by an Act of the Parliament Act No. XXXI of 1948 designated 'The National Cadet Corps Act 1948'. This Act with 13 clauses, prescribed the formation of the National Cadet Corps in India.

The first step in the process of raising of the NCC was setting up of the NCC Secretariat now called Headquarters Directorate General NCC. In fact, even before the NCC Bill was passed by the Constituent Assembly (Legislative), the Ministry of Defence had set up the nucleus of the NCC Secretariat, with Col (later retired as Chief of Army Staff) Gopal Gurunath Bewoor as first Director of the NCC. He took over as Director of NCC on 31st March, 1948.



INAUGURATION OF NCC

The NCC of Independent India was inaugurated on 15th July, 1948. The journey of this Indian youth organisation, which has now become the largest uniformed youth organisation in the world had begun.

ANNUAL ACTIVITIES

SESSION 2025-26



1. Awareness Programme on Sickle Cell Anaemia and Tribal Welfare Schemes (16 July, 2025)

An Awareness Programme on Sickle Cell Anaemia and Tribal Welfare Schemes was organized on 16 July 2025, in which 13 NCC cadets actively participated. The programme aimed to create awareness about Sickle Cell Anaemia, a hereditary blood disorder prevalent among certain tribal communities, and to disseminate information regarding various government welfare schemes available for the tribal population.



During the session, CTO Hukam Chand delivered an informative lecture on the causes, symptoms, prevention, diagnosis, and management of Sickle Cell Anaemia. He also explained various government initiatives related to education, healthcare, employment, and social security for tribal communities, encouraging the cadets to spread awareness among the public. The Principal, Dr. Kalyan Chand, appreciated the initiative and emphasized the importance of such awareness programmes in promoting public health and social welfare.



2. Orientation and Training Programme for Newcomers (24 July, 2025)

A one-day Orientation-cum-Training Programme was organized for Second and Final Year NCC cadets and students seeking fresh enrolment in NCC. A total of 45 students (25 newcomers and 20 enrolled NCC cadets) participated in the programme.



Former NCC Under Officer Ankita Thakur conducted drill and Drill Square Test (DST) training and emphasized the importance of discipline, leadership, and teamwork. She also delivered an informative talk on "Greening India's Barren Land", highlighting the role of tree plantation and environmental conservation in sustainable development. The programme was conducted under the guidance of CTO Hukam Chand, and the Principal, Dr. Kalyan Chand, motivated the participants to uphold the values of discipline, environmental responsibility, and active participation in nation-building.

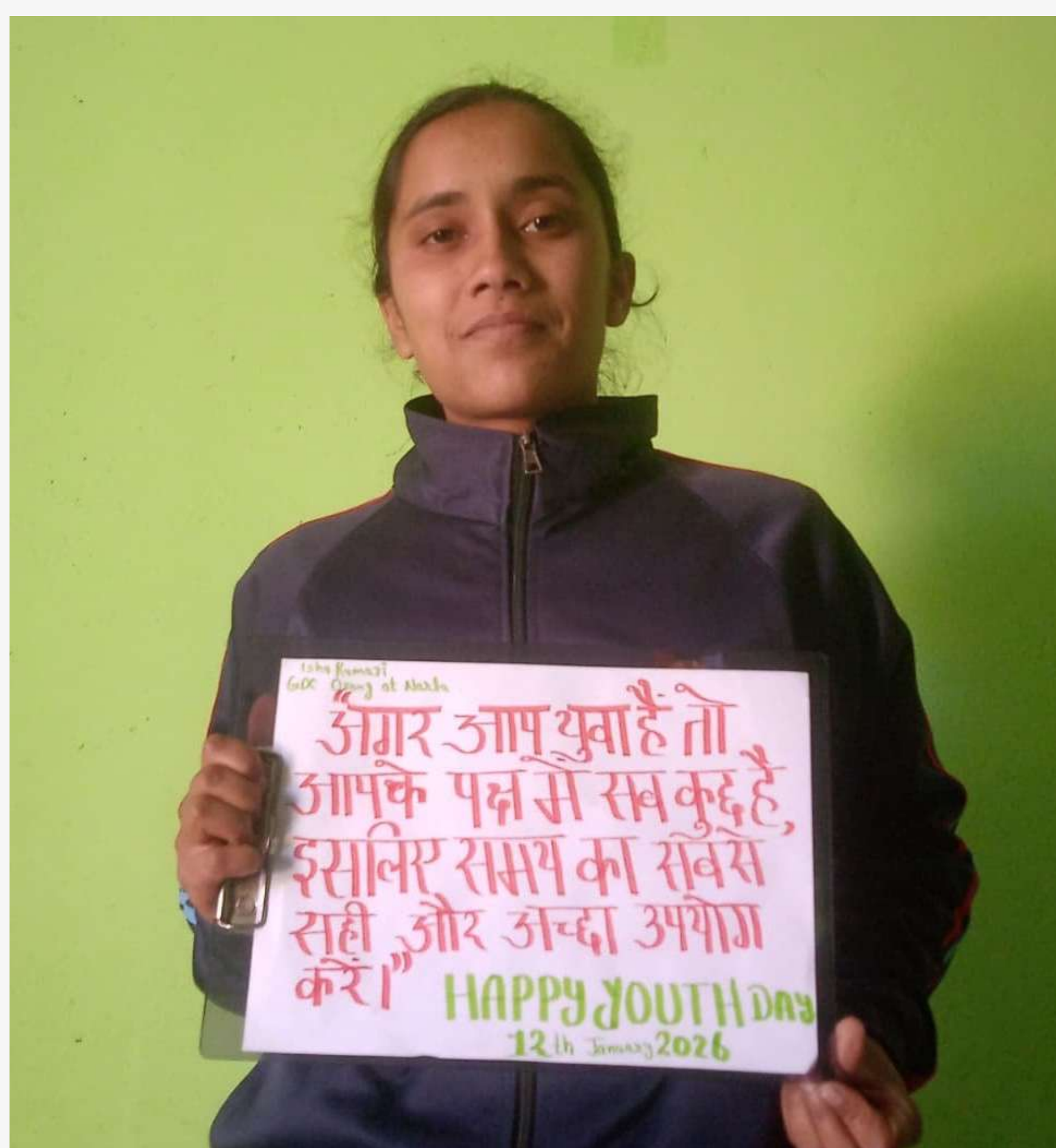
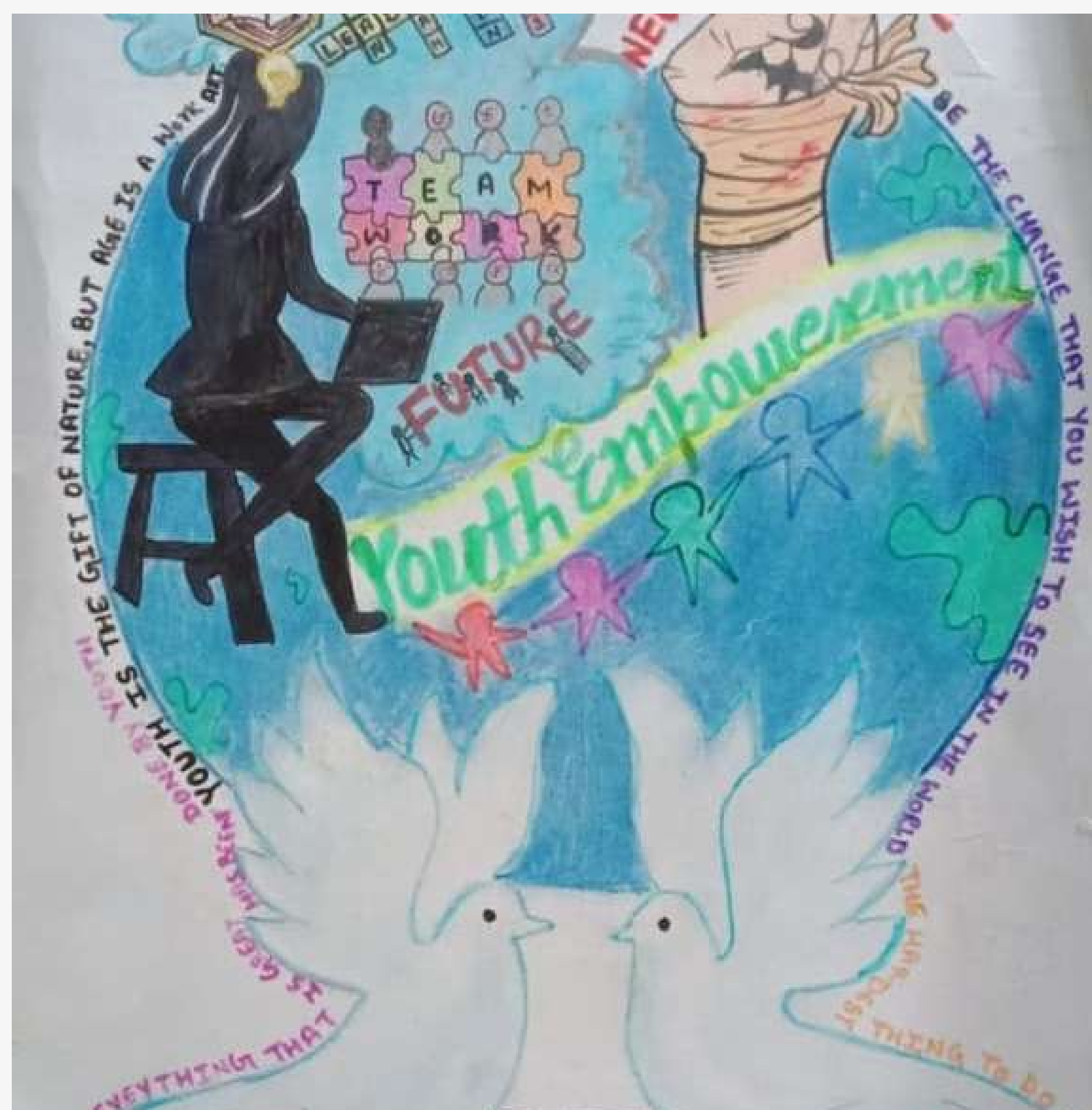
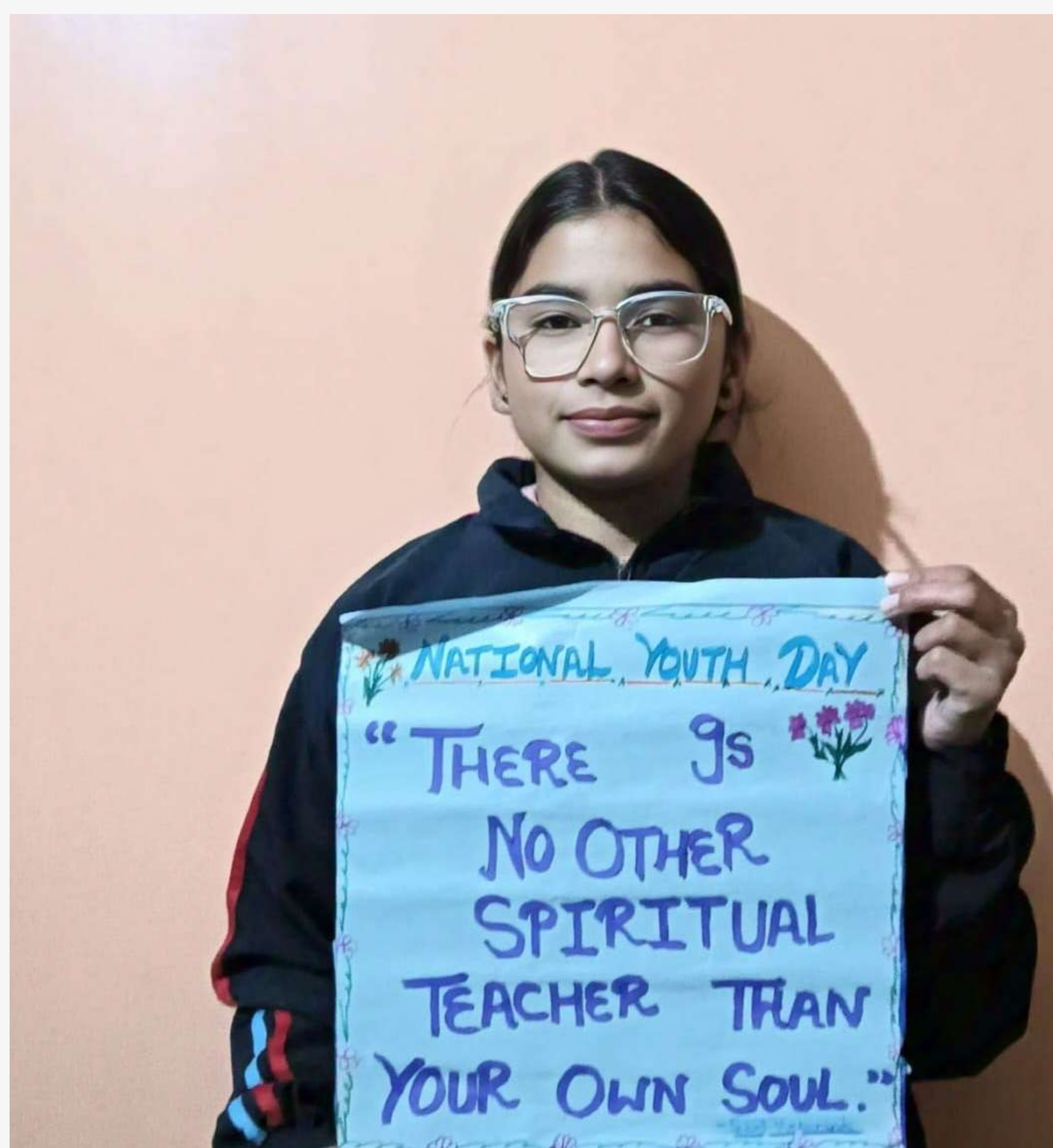
20. National Cyber Day & Cyber Hygiene & Digital Economy (28-30 Nov, 2025)

NCC cadets of Government Degree College Drang at Narla observed National Cyber Day, Cyber Hygiene & Digital Economy Awareness Programme from 28th to 30th November. 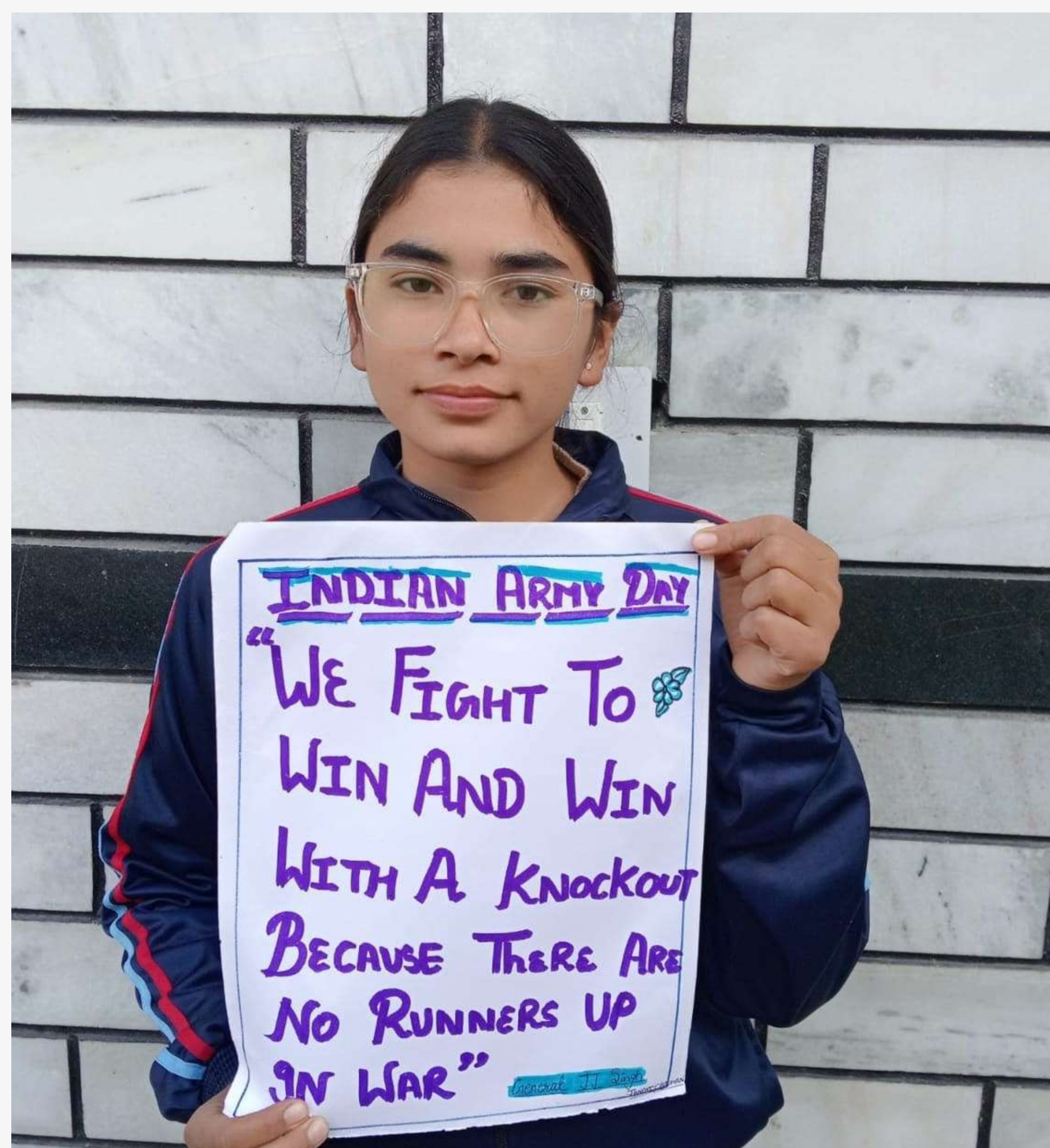
21. National Youth Day (12 Jan, 2026)

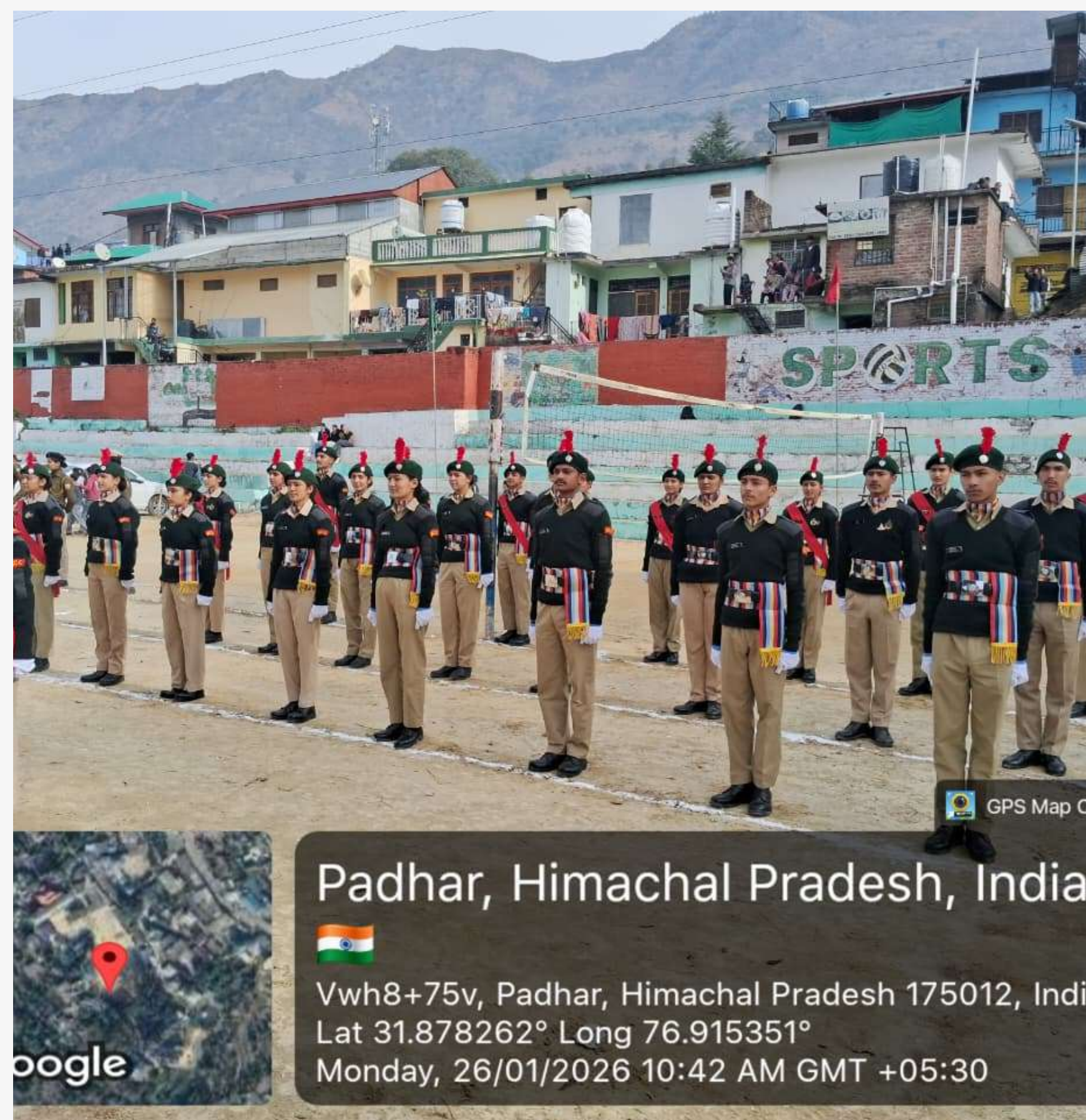
22. Army Day (15 Jan, 2026)

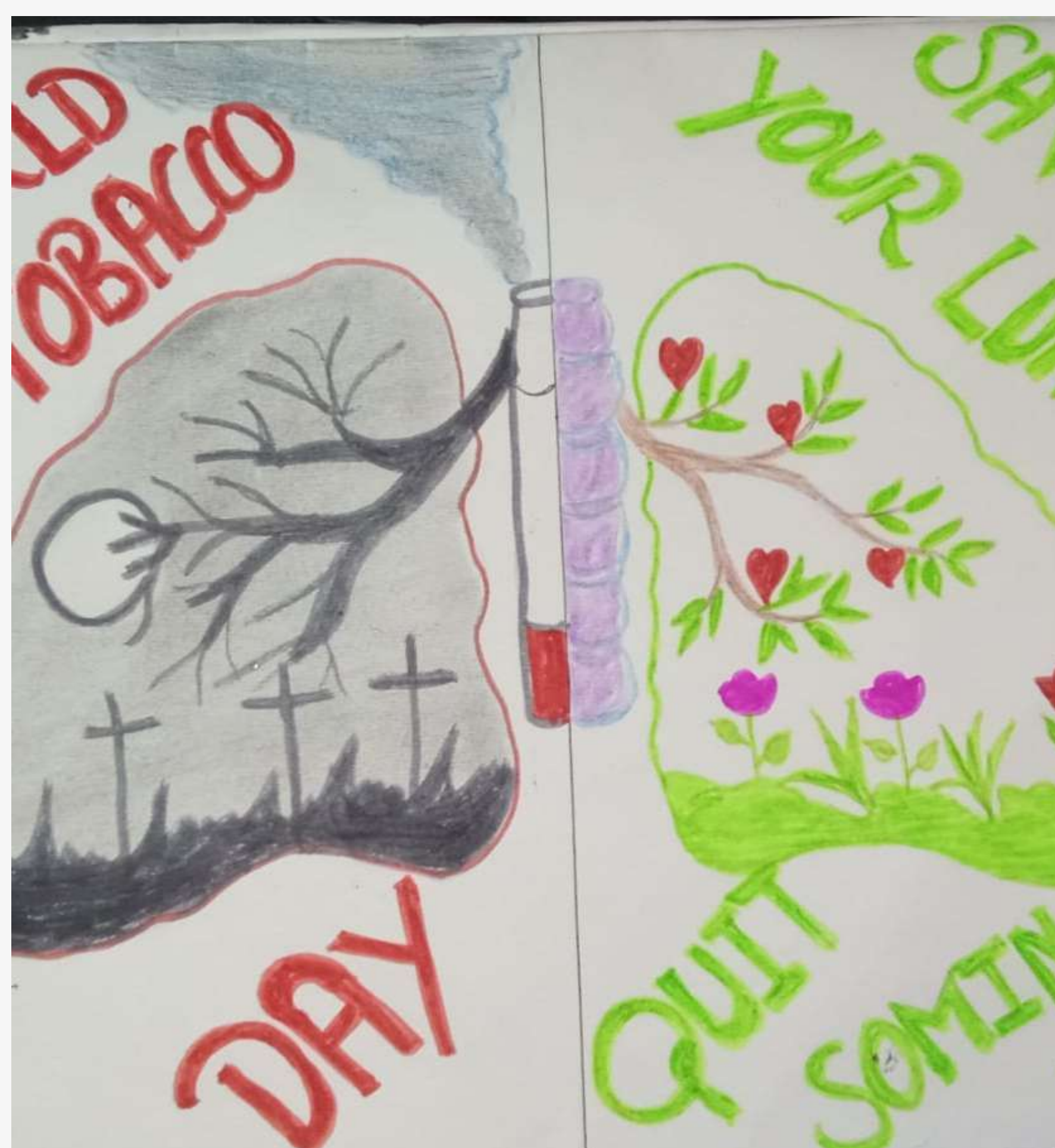
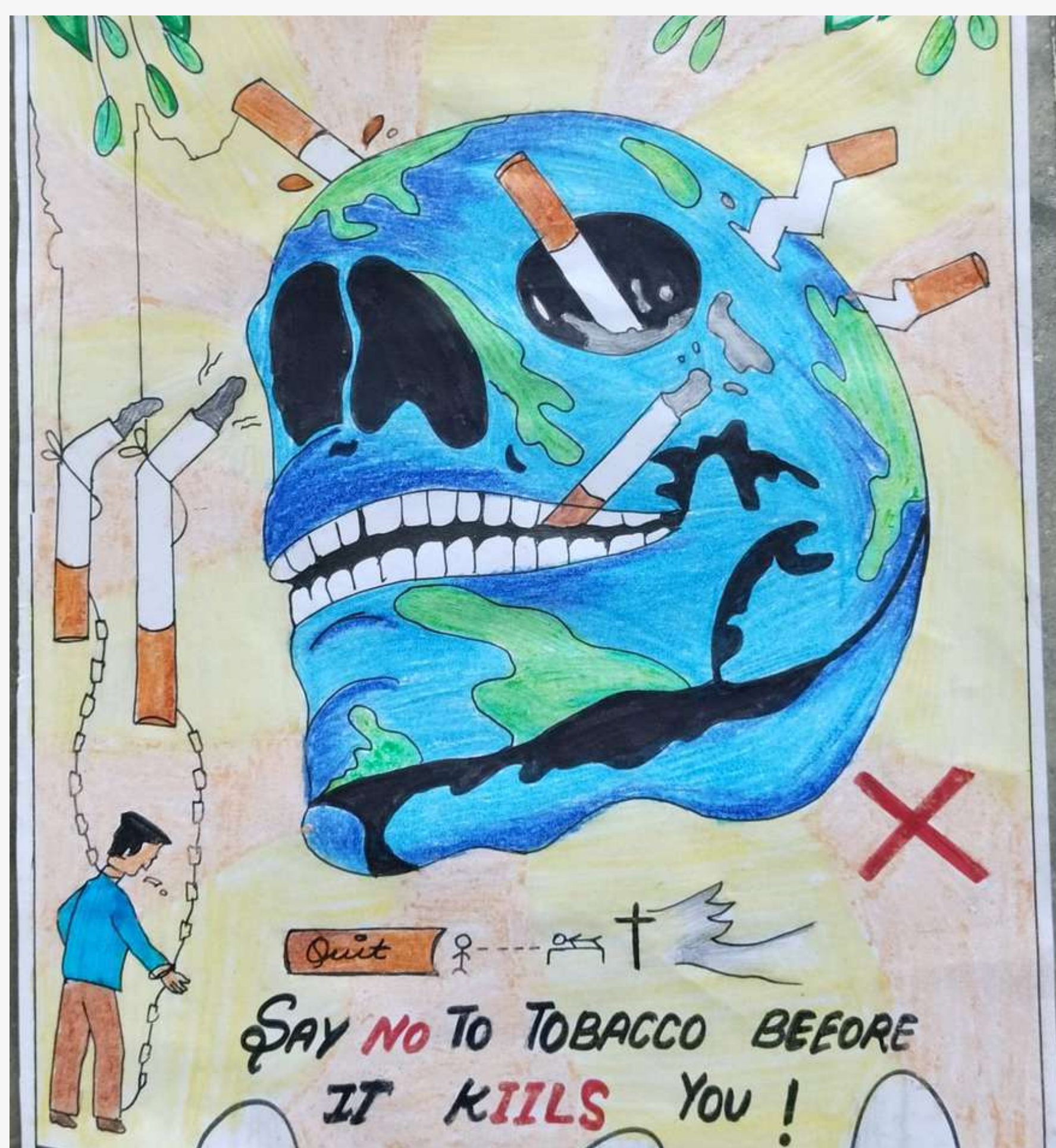
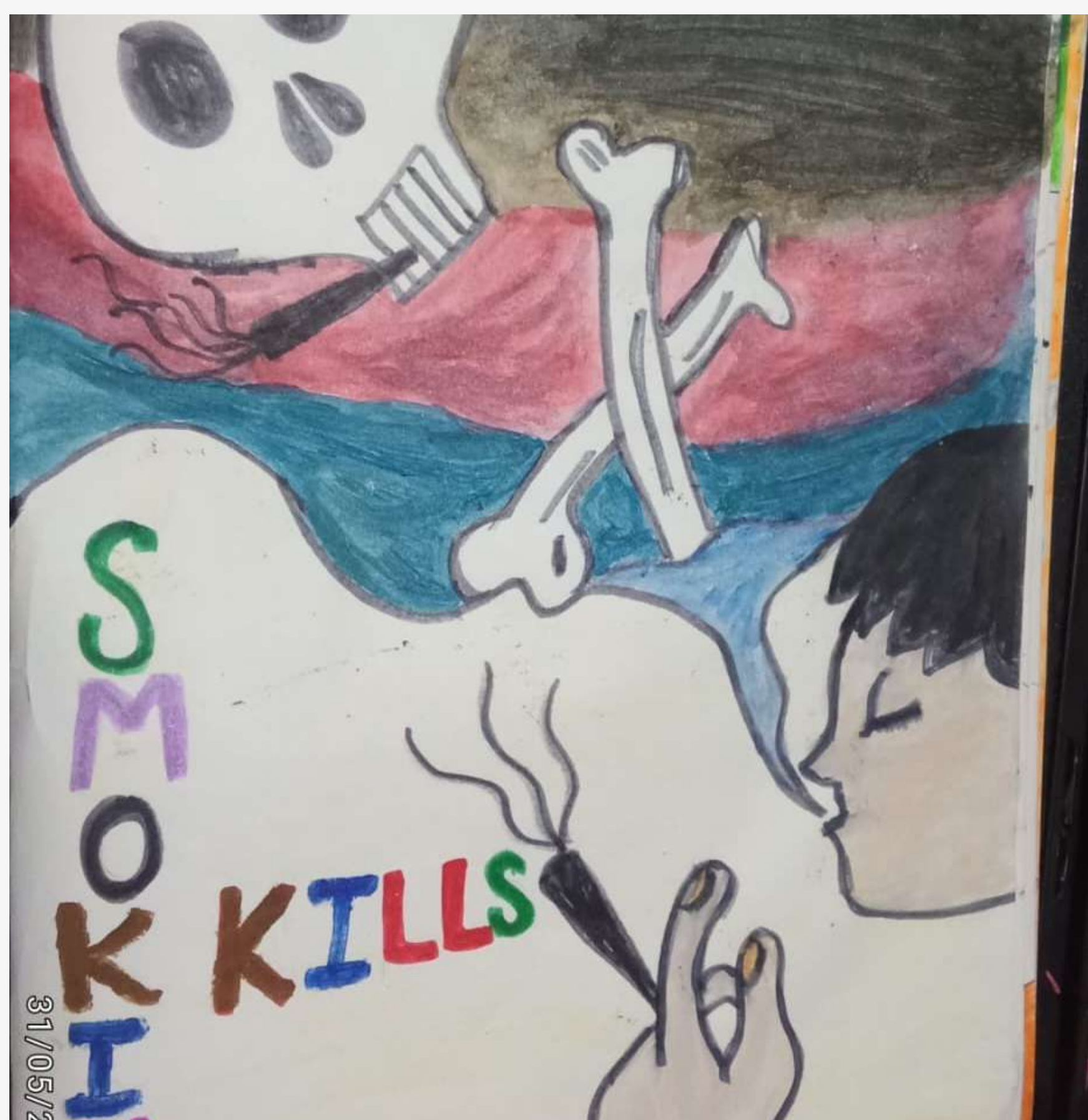
25. Operation Sindoor Commemoration (9 May, 2026)
