



5.4 Special New Innovative Initiatives Or Ideas Adopted in the College (Other than at Sr. No. 5.2 above)

1. CSCA Function 27/02/2025

(An Innovative Student-Centric Initiative to foster student participation, creativity, and leadership)

Introduction:

The College Students' Cultural Association (CSCA) Function was **organised on 27/02/2025 for the first time in the history of the college** as a significant and innovative initiative aimed at fostering student participation, creativity, and leadership. This landmark event marked a new chapter in the institutional effort to provide a vibrant cultural platform for holistic student development beyond the academic curriculum.

Objectives of the Initiative:

- To provide students with a formal platform to express their cultural, artistic, and creative talents.
- To encourage leadership, teamwork, and organisational skills among students.
- To promote inclusivity and active student engagement in co-curricular activities.
- To strengthen the sense of belonging and cultural identity within the campus.

Context:

Recognising the need for holistic education and experiential learning, the institution, and especially the Principal, Dr. Kalyan Chand Mnadhotra, took the innovative step of constituting and launching the College Students' Cultural Association (CSCA). Organising its inaugural function was a pioneering move to institutionalise cultural activities and place students at the centre of planning and execution.

The CSCA Function was meticulously planned under the guidance of faculty coordinators, with students taking the lead in conceptualising, organising, and managing the programme. Various committees were formed, including programme coordination, stage management, cultural events, hospitality, and discipline, ensuring democratic participation and responsibility-sharing among students.

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2. To support the Class IV employees to reinforce the values of dignity of labour, teamwork, and social responsibility among the staff.

1. Introduction

In anticipation of the Diwali festival and the need for comprehensive deep cleaning, the college organized a **Staff-Driven Cleanliness Drive on Oct 24, 2024**. The initiative was primarily undertaken **to extend active support to the Class IV employees**, who form the backbone of the institution's maintenance system. The drive highlights the college's commitment to shared responsibility, dignity of labour, and an inclusive work culture.

2. Innovative Aspects of the Activity

1. Shift from Task-Oriented Cleanliness to People-Centric Support

The drive focused on supporting Class IV employees facing health and manpower constraints, not merely on campus cleanliness.

2. Reversal of Conventional Institutional Roles

Teaching and administrative staff undertook manual cleaning, reinforcing equality and dignity of labour.

3. Empathy-Driven Institutional Response

The activity was planned in response to the physical limitations of Class IV staff, making it need-based and humane.

4. Leadership by Example

The Principal's active participation demonstrated inclusive and participatory leadership.

5. Integration of Social Values with Institutional Practice

The drive aligned national cleanliness ideals with institutional ethics and social responsibility.

6. Inclusive Participation Model

Class IV staff were involved according to their physical capacity, ensuring dignity without overburdening them.

7. Redefining Cleanliness as Collective Ownership

Cleanliness was treated as a shared responsibility of all staff, not a designated role.

8. Value-Based Professional Development for Staff

The activity served as experiential learning in empathy, teamwork, and social responsibility.



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9. Festival-Centred Social Solidarity

Conducted before Diwali, the drive promoted solidarity and collective care.

10. Sustainable Human-Centric Practice

The initiative strengthened a long-term culture of respect, inclusion, and ethical governance.

3. Background and Need

The college currently functions with **only one sweeper and four peons**, making day-to-day upkeep challenging. Moreover:

- **One peon is suffering from paralysis**, restricting her participation in physical cleaning activities.
- **Another peon has difficulty in movement due to a leg deformity**, affecting mobility and routine cleaning responsibilities.

Given these constraints, the **Principal recognized the urgent need to support the Class IV staff**, especially before Diwali when the campus requires deep and detailed cleaning. Their physical limitations and reduced workforce meant that accomplishing the required level of cleanliness would be extremely difficult for them alone.

Therefore, the cleanliness drive was planned **not merely as a routine activity, but as an intentional act of solidarity, support, and respect for the Class IV employees**, acknowledging their challenges and stepping forward to assist them meaningfully. He associated the task with govt initiated

4. Purpose and Objectives

The central purpose of the drive was:

- **To directly support the Class IV employees** by sharing their workload during a physically demanding period.
- **To acknowledge their indispensable contribution** and stand with them in times of need.
- To prepare the campus for Diwali through deep cleaning.
- To reinforce the values of empathy, cooperation, and dignity of labour among all staff members.
- To cultivate a culture where all employees—regardless of designation—participate in maintaining institutional cleanliness.

5. Participants



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The initiative saw wholehearted participation from:

- **Teaching Staff**
- **Administrative Staff**
- Class IV staff members (in supportive roles depending on physical capacity)
- Led by the **Principal** and supervised by the **IQAC**

The staff's collective involvement symbolized **a unified gesture of standing by the Class IV employees.**

6. Areas Covered

The cleaning covered:

- Classrooms, corridors, and staircases
- Laboratories and library sections
- Staff rooms and administrative block
- Water and sanitation units
- The entire college compound, entrances, and pathways

Special attention was given to areas that are usually difficult for Class IV staff with physical limitations to manage alone.

7. Activities Conducted

- Sweeping, mopping, scrubbing, and dusting
- Cleaning fans, windows, furniture, and lights
- Removing cobwebs and cleaning corners
- Waste segregation and proper disposal
- Clearing outdoor areas, corridors, and pathways

Each task was performed **with the intention of relieving the physical burden** on the limited Class IV staff.

8. Impact and Significance

The drive had several meaningful impacts:



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- **Substantial reduction in workload for Class IV employees**, especially vital considering the health challenges within the team.
- Improved morale among Class IV workers, who felt respected, supported, and uplifted.
- Strengthened staff unity rooted in empathy and mutual respect.
- Increased awareness among staff about the essential role and struggles of Class IV employees.
- Establishment of a culture of shared responsibility for cleanliness, rather than leaving it solely to the Class IV staff.

Above all, the event demonstrated that **the institution values the dignity, well-being, and challenges of its Class IV workers**, reinforcing humane and inclusive workplace values.

9. Feedback

The Class IV employees expressed heartfelt gratitude for the support extended during a time when their limited number and their physical limitations made the work overwhelming. Teachers and non-teaching staff shared that participating in the drive helped them better understand the extent of daily effort invested by Class IV staff in maintaining the institution.

10. Conclusion

The Staff-Driven College Building Cleanliness Drive was not merely a cleanliness activity, but **a compassionate and deliberate effort to support and uplift Class IV employees**. Led by the Principal, this initiative demonstrated exemplary leadership, solidarity, and a deep regard for human values. The college commits to organizing such supportive initiatives regularly, ensuring dignity, respect, and well-being for all sections of employees.



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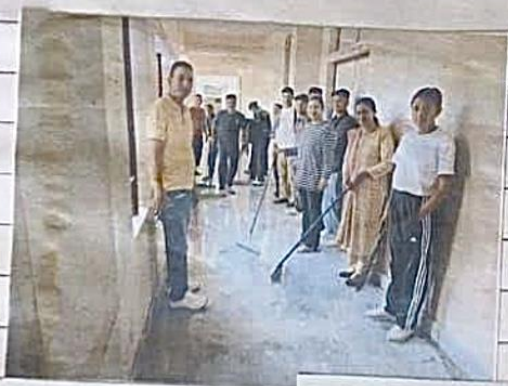
Cleanliness Drive Organized at Government College Drang at Narla
