



### GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE DRANG AT NARLA

The college vests in the lap of nature, far from the madding crowd, in an environment friendly atmosphere surrounded by pine forest on one hand and glorified by a panoramic view of the snow laden peaks of Dhauladhar on the other hand. Government Degree Nestled in the lap of nature, the Government Degree College Drang at Narla stands as a beacon of academic excellence, far removed from the cacophony of the urban sprawl. The institution is enveloped by a serene landscape, with the majestic pine forests on one side and the breathtaking panorama of the snowcapped Dhauladhar peaks on the other. Established with the aim to craft a holistic and vibrant learning environment, the college is founded on value-based academic principles. Strategically located 27 kilometers from Mandi town, 2.5 kilometers from Kunnu, and 3.5 kilometers from Padhar, the college sprawls over an expansive 63.07 bighas of land, accessible via motorable roads from three sides. ### **CURRICULUM FOR UNDERGRADUATE COURSES**

#### UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective and skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated by following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marking system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers to assess the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

#### **Outline of Choice Based Credit System:-**

- 1. <u>Core Course / Discipline Specific Course (DSC):</u> A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core subject is termed as a Core course. Core course is also referred as Discipline Specific Course (DSC). The course, designed under this category, aims to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.
- 2. **Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from the pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

<u>Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course</u>: Elective courses which may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred as Discipline Specific Elective.

<u>Dissertation/Project:-</u> An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work. A candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

Generic Elective (GE) Course (for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses /Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses/Foundation Course: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses are of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) and Ability Enhancement Elective Course (AEEC). "AECC" courses are based on the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. They are: (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL (Modern Indian Language) Communication (mandatory for all disciplines). AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill- based and are aimed to provide hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

Ability Enhancement Elective Course (AEEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction. Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course which involves application of knowledge to analyze and explore the real life situation and difficult problems. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

4. **Practical/Tutorials:** (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper).

## Regulations Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):-

#### **Definitions**

**Credit:** Credit stands for the following

- 1. Term has a connotation of achievement to earn through learning efforts.
- 2. It implies successful completion of a course of study being measured in terms of classroom instruction hours/weeks in courses being studied in that year.
- 3. It implies learning efforts on the part of the learner.
- 4. It measures the volume of the content to be delivered in the course.
- 5. Credits of a course indicate the weight age of a course for the calculation of Grade Point Average (GPA).

<u>Annual system:</u> Annual means a twelve month academic term with teaching for 33 weeks, excluding duration of Minor Test, Assignments, Annual Examinations (AE) and Winter Breaks.

<u>Tutorial Session:</u> It consists of Participatory/Problem Solving/Deskwork/Brief Seminar/Group Discussion or any other methods that make learners absorb and assimilate the knowledge effectively.

**<u>Practical Session:</u>** It consists of hands on experience/Laboratory experiment/ case studies/ field studies that equip students to acquire skill component.

#### **Choosing Study Courses**

A student will be required to accumulate a certain minimum number of credits in order to qualify the UG Degree.

For Bachelor Degree Program, the students will have the limited choice of subjects available in the college.

The students will have to accumulate prescribed minimum successful credit hours of course work for Bachelor Degree over a minimum of 3 and maximum of 5 Years from the date of admission as per HPU norms.

#### Students' Assessment and Evaluation

All courses involve an evaluation system with Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA), according to 70-30% weightage i.e. 70% for Annual Examination (AE) and remaining 30% for Internal Assessment.

Note: A student will have to secure at least 35% in both the components i.e. CCA and Annual Examination, but 40% in aggregate to become eligible to be declared successful in the course. Only those students will be allowed to appear in the Annual Examination who have been successful in CCA.

#### **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):**

This would have the following components:

**Classroom Attendance and Incentives**: Each student will have to attend minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorials/Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the Annual Examination.

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= 75% but < 80% 1 mark
= 80% but < 85% 2 marks
= 85% but < 90% 3 marks
= 90% but < 95% 4 marks
= 95% and above 5 marks
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**House Test:** There will be one House Test conducted when approximately 75% of the syllabus is covered. This House Term Test will be of 15 Marks.

<u>Seminar/ Assignment/ Term Paper</u>: 10 Marks of CCA will be awarded on the basis of classroom activities viz. Seminar/Assignment/Term paper/Quiz/Presentation etc.

Annual Examination (AE):70% of final grade will be on the basis of Annual Examination that will be of three hours duration. Annual Examination will be based on the complete syllabus of the course.

#### **ADMISSION PROCESS 2024-25**

#### B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com.-I, -II and -III Year

#### **ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS:**

A student will be eligible for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.-I Year, if he/she has passed the Senior Secondary (10+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P Board of School Education or any other examination considered as equivalent.

- (i) The candidates seeking admission in B.Sc.-1<sup>st</sup> year should have passed the qualifying examination in science stream with 45% marks or equivalent grade for general category and 5% relaxation for SC/ST candidates.
- (ii) The candidates who have passed the qualifying examination in Commerce stream shall be given preference to B.Com. Program.

**Age Limit:** Maximum age limit for the admission in BA/BSc/BCom-1st course is 23 years for boys and 25 years for girls of general category. There is three years age relaxation for SC/ST candidates as per University norms as on 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to a maximum of three months.

#### **ADMISSION:-**

Every candidate seeking admission to any class will apply on the prescribed form available online on College website.

For admission to II and III Year, attach Mark sheet / Admit card of previous exam passed / appeared in.

The applicant of II & III Year will deposit the fee after the form is verified and approved by the members of the admission committee online. The students of 1<sup>st</sup>Year will deposit their fee after the forms have been verified offline.

In case of any clarification or guidance, the applicant can approach Guidance and Counseling Cell of the college.

Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such a candidate

Initially all admissions shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by HPU/SPU. Rules of admission are subject to change as per the Himachal Pradesh University/Sardar Patel University notifications issued from time to time

No admission will be granted after the last date of admission.

**NOTE:-** ANY CANDIDATE WITH COMPARTMENT IN 10+2 IS NOT ELIGIBLE TO SEEK ADMISSION IN UNDER GRADUATE COURSES.

#### DOCUMENTS REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

#### B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.-1st Year: -

The scanned copies of the following documents are required at the time of filling of online admission form:

- Passport size photographs.
- Matriculation certificate for Date of Birth.
- 10+2 Marks sheet.
- All girls candidates have to submit a copy of Bonafide Himachali certificate to avail the benefit of relaxation from tuition fee as per Govt. notification No. EDN-H(8) 3(7)1/76 dated 29-06-01.
- Scanned copies of category certificate (SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/BPL/EWS), if claimed.
- 40% disability certificate.
- <u>Latest character certificate</u> Issued by the Head of the institution last attended. In case of private candidate latest character certificate by some H.P. Govt. Gazetted Class I Officer or any other competent authority.
- A certificate from competent authority in case of single girl child.
- The gap of one year or more in the academic career (after 10+2) of an applicant must be supported by undertaking, as the proof of his/her activities during the period of gap.

Note: The Character certificate must not have been issued more than six months prior to the date of admission. In such cases fresh character certificate must be obtained from Gazetted Class- I officer or the Panchayat Pradhan of the village.

#### **REFUSAL OF ADMISSION**

Compartment candidate in 10+2 will not be eligible for admission in under graduate courses. The Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during the previous years in spite of the eligibility for admission.

The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.

#### MODE OF SELECTION

The admission to B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. Course will be made purely on the basis of merit of the previous qualifying examination.

#### RESERVATION OF SEATS

Our institution follows the reservation policy of H.P. Government and H.P. University/Sardar Patel University in admissions.

Note: One Seat will be reserved for the single girl child.

# **Note**

- Every student has to pay Rs 400-per annum as PTA Fund.
- Funds and Tuition Fee for the entire session shall be charged from the time of joining the college on migration from other institution.
- Computer practical fee for Commerce of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Year students shall be charged @ 180/– per subject.
- Rs. 100 will be charged extra from the students migrated from other colleges on account of library security.
- Fine if any, from the students will be collected in the month of March before the commencement of Annual Examination.
- Fees and Funds once paid shall not be refunded in any case.

Parent Teachers' Association (PTA): The College has constituted Parent Teachers Association. Every student is supposed to contribute Rs 400/- per annum towards PTA. The General House of the PTA is held in the month of July/August every year.

**Migration:** The admission of the students migrated during the same course/session from one affiliated college or institution (including ICDEOL) to another affiliated college or institution shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of the University from time to time.

#### **LIBRARY AND ITS RULES**

The college library has books pertaining to all the disciplines taught in the college in the General Section as well as in the Reference Section. The college has a regular subscription of newspapers (Hindi and English), magazines and journals for the benefit of students and teachers.

#### All the students are required to adhere to the following Library rules strictly:

- All the students on the rolls of the college are eligible to become members of the college library.
- Every student is entitled to draw two books from the library for reading at home for a period of 30 days.
- The borrower shall be solely responsible for the safety/preservation of the books drawn by him/her.
- A fine of Rs. 1/- per day per book will be charged beyond due date of submission of the book from the defaulter students.
- In case a book is found mutilated, torn, defaced or misplaced the actual cost of the book plus additional fine will be charged from such defaulter students.
- Reference books are to be consulted in library, only after obtaining permission from the Librarian.
- Students can get their library security refunded within one year after leaving the college; otherwise the security will stand forfeited

#### **IDENTITY CARD**

- Identity card is the most important document of the college student, because it is the only identification for anyone to establish and produce.
- Any kind of transaction between students and college is entertained only after production of Identity card. If a student has to deal with any kind of work related to examination, library, collection/inspection of any kind of document, one has to produce his/her Identity card first in order to establish his identity.
- A student is not permitted to replace his/her photograph pasted on the Identity card for any reason whatsoever.
- If Identity card is lost, one has to file a report in the Police Station in order to get a duplicate Identity card issued for a sum of Rs 20.

#### Students should always carry their Identity cards while entering the college premises.

In the event of surprise check of Identity card or for any other reason, if the student is unable to produce the Identity card he/she will be handed over to the police or as the situation may demand. Students without Identity card are deemed as outsiders.

The concerned student shall be held responsible for his/her deeds in case, the Identity Card gets misplaced or misused by anti-social elements. It is the personal responsibility of the student to keep his/her Identity card in safe custody.

#### **LEAVE RULES**

- It is compulsory for all the students to get their leave sanctioned before availing any kind of leave.
- The student is required to submit a medical certificate of leave on medical grounds, for more than one week.
  - Leave upto one week will be sanctioned by the concerned teacher. For leave extending more than one week's duration, the student shall have to apply to the Principal.
- A student will not be allowed to avail more than 10 days leave during the entire academic session, except under exceptional circumstances.
- If a student remains absent for 10 days continuously without information, his/her name will be struck off from the rolls of the college.
- Even if a student is on leave, he/she will have to deposit his/her fee as per the scheduled dates decided by the college.

### **RE-ADMISSION**

Students can seek re-admission twice during the session. First re-admission will be allowed within 10 days after the name is struck off. A fine of Rs.100/- will be charged for the first time and a fine of Rs. 200/- will be charged for the second re-admission within 10 days after the name is struck off from the rolls.

Students securing less than 50% marks in aggregate or in the subject concerned or not passing the examination in any subject shall not be considered for the prizes. College Roll of Honour will be awarded to a student securing a position in HPU merit list.

#### **Prizes for Co-curricular Activities:**

First, second and third position in individual and team events in HPU or State Level in sports and cultural activities. First, second and third positions in various co-curricular activities at college level. NSS Group Leader and Best Volunteer (Boy & Girl), Best Rover and Best Ranger, Best volunteer Eco Club, Red Cross Society and Red Ribbon Club.

#### **CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

The various curricular activities in the class rooms help to impart knowledge to students as per the demands of the examination system, but unless certain other activities are undertaken, a student never acquires a sense of perfection and achievement. So the role of co-curricular activities comes in. Such activities along with class room involvement help to integrate three vital aspects of a student namely - the body, mind and soul. With the above objectives in mind, various Clubs and Societies have been constituted. Students are advised to join at least one of the Clubs and Societies to become ennobled graduates on completion of their courses in this college.



## **RAGGING**

There will be **Zero Tolerance To Ragging**. Any Student Involved in any form of ragging will be punished accordingly:

- ➤ Imprisonment, fine or both.
- Expulsion from the college.
- > Suspension from the classes.
- > Fine with public apology.
- With holding scholarship or other benefits
- Debarring from representation in events.
- Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated.
- If any student faces any kind of problem in the college related to ragging, he/she should contact the anti ragging committee immediately.

#### **Discipline & other Important Instructions**

The following acts will be considered as misconduct and indiscipline. Any student involved will be punished with fine or suspension/expulsion or both for:-

- Not carrying his/her Identity card.
- ➤ Writing obscenities/ dirty words on blackboards, walls or furniture
- Banging doors and other items of furniture.
- Loitering in the college campus, making noise or trying to disturb the classes.
- > Smoking, taking drugs/alcohol, chewing tobacco and spitting in the college campus.
- > Bringing outsiders, miscreants, anti social elements in the campus.
- > Pasting posters on the walls or on the notice board without prior permission of the Principal.
